

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

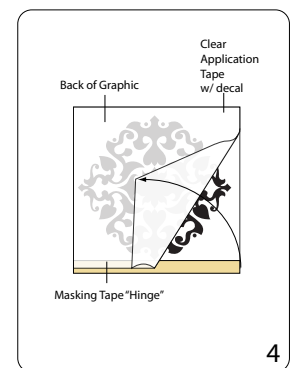
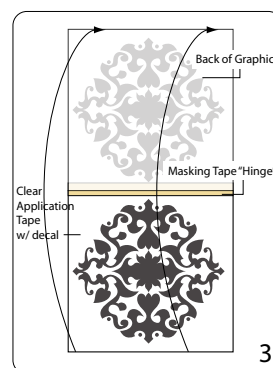
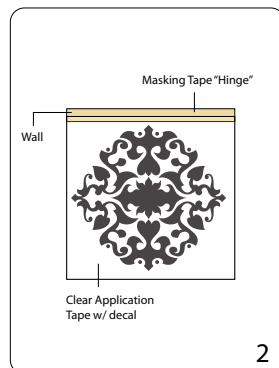
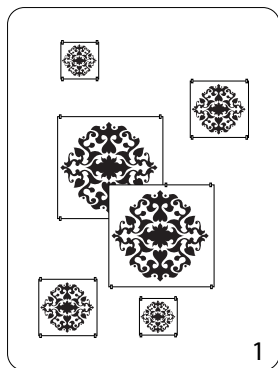
Applying your custom vinyl graphic is easy enough to do by yourself. The following tools are recommended when applying vinyl decals or lettering. Masking tape *Level * Squeegee (credit Card) * Pin or exacto knife (optional)

Cleaning Procedures:

All surfaces are contaminated to some degree. To ensure good adhesion to any vehicle surface it is critical that you follow these recommended procedures in decontaminating and preparing the surface prior to any vinyl product installation.

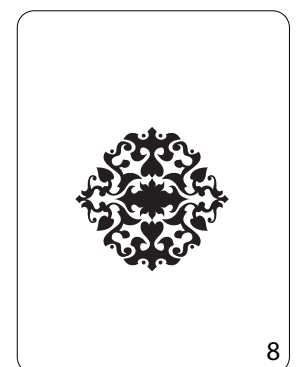
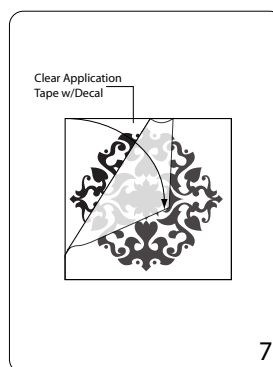
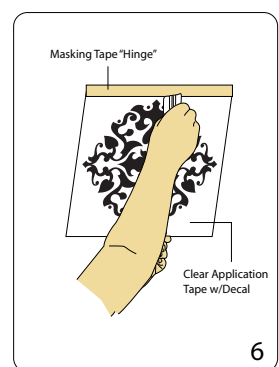
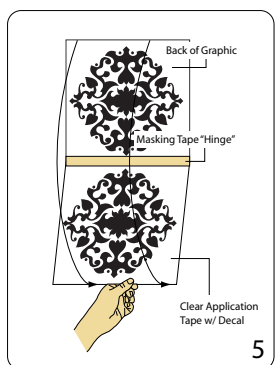
1. Wash and rinse the area with liquid dish detergent and warm water. Then dry the vehicle surface with a clean, lint-free towel or cloth.
2. Finish up the cleaning process by wiping down the entire area with Isopropyl Alcohol (rubbing alcohol optional). To avoid recontamination during the final cleaning step, wipe the surface in just one direction, using a clean, lint-free towel or cloth. You are now ready to apply the vinyl.

4. Install your wall graphics. Apply low tack masking tape across one side of the decal, making a 'hinge' with surface (fig 2). Lift up graphic and starting from one corner, slowly peel off backing paper, leaving decal stuck to the clear application tape (fig 3 & 4). If part of the decal should stick to the backing paper, rub the backing paper in the problem area and continue peeling. Careful – the back surface is now sticky!



Bring decal down, pulling slightly from surface keep it taut (fig 5). Working from the 'hinge', use the provided application tool to smooth over the entire decal with firm pressure, applying the graphic to your wall. Make sure to smooth over the whole surface with even pressure (fig 6).

Remove clear application tape by starting from a corner and slowly peeling back tape at a 180° angle, making sure that the decal is stuck to your wall as you pull (fig 7). If the part of the decal should stick to the clear application tape instead of the surface don't panic! Stop peeling, lay decal back on the wall, smooth over problem area, and continue peeling. Repeat for remaining decals and stand back to admire your handiwork! (fig 8)



To remove graphics, use a fingernail to gently pry up one corner of the decal and slowly pull off wall.
